


Timor Leste

- In 2013, 37.7% children <5 years -underweight




RAM in Timor Leste

What is the Grant?

- Grant title: Malaria elimination in border towns in Timor Leste
- Multi-district, humanitarian project
- Amount USD251,334
- 18 months duration
- Partners:
 - International Rotarians (D9830)
 - Host Rotarians (D9550)
 - Corporating Organisation National Malaria Program

Donations

- 15 Districts have pledged the District Designated Funds (DDF)
- 13 Rotary Clubs in D9800
- 1 Rotary Club Queenbeyan D9710
- 1 Rotary Club Deloraine D9830
- Matching funds from TRF
- = Total USD251,334

What is it for?

- 40,000 long lasting insecticidal nets (LLINs)
 & 80 Hudson Sprayers for indoor residual spraying
- Training in community education and use of LLINs for community volunteers, midwives and Rotarians
- Beneficiaries: Pregnant Women and children under 5 years old

Grant Objectives

- 1. Contribute to preventing the re-introduction of malaria in vulnerable populations (pregnant women).
- Increase community engagement in malaria elimination strategies through community education in project locations
